THE ASHES

Leader: On Ash Wednesday, we publicly show we want to “bring to ashes” those things in us that are not good. By confessing our sins and having them burned to ashes we acknowledge ourselves as sinners determined to grow into better persons. We keep in mind that the goal is new life just as Jesus experience it in His resurrection. To share in new life, we must die to the old. The ashes remind us that we join with Jesus in his ministry, death, and resurrection.

#### THE INVITATION

Pastor: Anyone who wishes to make the mark of the cross on their person is invited to come forward at the end of the service and touch finger to ash in the dish, smearing the ash on their forehead or hand.

#### THE BLESSING OF THE ASHES

Pastor: Let us pray. God our Creator, you sent your beloved Son Jesus to be our brother. The burden of your love for humankind led him to accept death, even death on a cross, so that all people might live. Though we have been buried with Christ and raised up to new life of freedom, we have not lived fully as your sons and daughters; your kingdom of love is still not fully manifest in us. Bless these ashes. Grant that this may be a symbol of our inner renewal, a sign of our change and growth in Christ. Amen.
